- **3.** Strictly **check for Plagiarism** (using any popular plagiarism software freely available online), for copyright infringements and publication ethics.
- **4.** Upload the submission **through the link provided on our college website** strictly before the deadline *i.e.* **1**st **Jan 2018.**
- 5. Register the Details of the Participants online through the registration link.
- **6.** The **submission / registration link** will be open by 20th of December 2017.

Submission Guidelines

- ✓ Only on-line submissions within the given time-schedule (12.00 noon on 1st January 2018) will be entertained.
- The submission will be on neatly typed MS-Word document on A4 page setup with margins of 1 inch on all sides, single line spacing, page numbered and 'Garamond' font with max. word limit of 5000.
- ✓ Use standard indentation for paragraphs. Document should contain no pictures/images except for figures/tables/graphs.
- ✓ Footnotes should appear at the bottom of the page on which they are cited/referenced.
- Tables and Figures should be numbered in Roman Numerals and can appear only at the end of the manuscript. Sources of data used in both tables and figures should be duly acknowledged as a footnote to the same.
- In case some abbreviations and acronyms are used in the tables and figures, these should be duly described in the main body text of the manuscript where they have been cited/referenced/interpreted and well as in the footnotes of the table/ figure.
- Tables and figures appearing at the end of the manuscript should be duly referenced in the main body text where these have been interpreted.
- All Figures (charts, diagrams or line drawings) should be of clear quality, in black and white. For figures which cannot be supplied in MS Word, acceptable standard image format is pdf only.
- Research Methodology used in the manuscript should be explained in detail and all mathematical equations (if any) should be typed using MathType or any equation editor, should be consecutively numbered using Arabic numerals in parentheses.
- Sources of data used in the study should be duly acknowledged and the procedures used to convert raw data into usable data should be explained in detail.
- At the end of the manuscript, all references cited in the body text should be complete in all respects and arranged in alphabetical order. Authors should carefully check the list of references for completeness, accuracy and consistency.
- Strictly follow the 'Harvard' pattern for references and for citations (See and follow: http://guides.lib.monash.edu/citing-referencing/harvard)
- ✓ All submissions must strictly attach a plagiarism-check report using any popular software (check freely available software online) with no similarities above 10%.
