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Workshop on Advanced 3D printing

29th June - 7th Jul 18



A workshop on **Advanced 3D Printing** was organized by Infinity 3D and Center for Incubation and Business Acceleration (CIBA) on 29th, 30th June and on 7th, 8th July 2018. The Resource Person for the workshop was Mr. Ryan Vaz. Four students, Ankit Kumar Gupta, Afonso Sheldon, Asif Shaikh and Sammit Chodenkar from TYBCA of the College participated in the workshop.

On 29th June 2018 - Day-1- The participants were introduced to 3D printing, its evolution and applications in hospitals, car models, etc. They were given a demo on how to use Sketchup which is the software used to create a model and to use the tools of the software. This was followed by a demo on Netfabb, another software used to check the models created in Sketchup and resolve any design issues and errors encountered in the model. Finally they were given a hands-on session on Flash print software which is used to give a preview of how the model will get printed by the 3D printer.

On 30th June 2018 - Day - 2- The resource person began the session by briefing them about the different types of 3D printers and their applications. They were given a demo to use the 3D printer on how to load the material in the printer and how to set up the printer bed where the model gets printed. Later they were given a task where they were divided into groups of 3 students each and assigned a task to create a model of a car of their own choice. They had to use their creativity to design a car and then print it. They were given a specification for the car, mentioning that the car should move when air pressure is applied. During the last session, a car race of the models was held, where the model designed by Ankit Kumar Gupta's team won.

On 07th July 2018- Day -3- Mr. Ryan Vaz demonstrated the use of different techniques for printing so that the object has a smooth finish. He then briefed them about the different trouble-shooting techniques to resolve the issues designers face when printing the models, how to minimize the cost of printing and make the object stronger. They were then given a task to design a working fidget spinner. Afonso Sheldon's team was first to show a working model of the fidget spinner.

On 08th July 2018-Day-4 - The participants were given the task of making some models which will help people. As a group they were asked to have a brainstorming session and come up with many ideas and choose one of it. The competition was held between 2 teams. One team from the College decided to make a pen holder for physically challenged people who don't have some fingers and the other team



decided to make a headphone holder. Afonso Sheldon's team won the task for designing a pen holder for the physically challenged.

The workshop on 3D printing was very informative and a great learning experience for the participants who can consider specialization in this area and take it up as a career option as well.

Seminar on Financial Wellness

The BoI official briefed about the scheme, introduced by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 8th April 2015. The PMMY scheme basically focuses on women individual entrepreneurs or a joint venture wanting to



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start a venture together to start small new enterprises or business.

The loan provided under this scheme is up to Rs. 10 lakhs, to non-corporate, non-farm or micro enterprises. The three products created under this scheme namely Shishu, Kishore and Tarun were discussed in brief. The officials discussed about the various documents required to avail this scheme as well as the procedure relating to loans and various loans offered by Bank of India to students followed by open discussion session.

The programme was attended by 08 BBA(FS) students, 04 BCA students, 01 B.com student and 07 M.Com students along with the accompanying teacher Ms. Grishmi Thakur.

Tech Talk on Microsoft Technologies

TechTrendz, the Technology Club of the **Department of Computer Science** of the College organized the 1st Tech Talk session on **Microsoft Technologies** in association with Microsoft Developer Community on 09th July 2018.

The Resource Person for the session was Mr.

Vibhav Patil, Leader of Microsoft Developer Community, Goa. 50 students along with all the faculty members attended the session. The session aimed at providing the students with an opportunity to get an industry level understanding of what is needed and how to work with Microsoft Technologies in order to build cross platform general purpose, mobile and gaming applications.

Mr. Sumit Kumar, Assistant Professor, Computer Science introduced the resource person and informed the audience about the purpose of the session. Resource person, Mr. Vibhav Patil enlightened the students about Microsoft Development Platform and other Microsoft technologies like, WPF, Azure, HoloLens, Artificial Intelligence, Xamarin, and C#. He also informed the audience about the opportunities and importance of Digital Marketing, Social Media, SEO, and Cloud Platform in current IT Scenario which they can look at as career options.

Mr. Vibhav Patil encouraged the students to take up live projects and consider developing cross platform mobile application development using Xamarin. He recommended using HoloLens for development of applications based on augmented reality, virtual reality and gaming.

The session was very well received and appreciated by the students as it built their curiosity to learn more and to explore these softwares. Some students expressed their desire to take up these innovative projects in their Final Year. The students also suggested to conducted workshop in the area of AI, and C#. The session was very well conducted with interesting videos and presentations which kept the students glued to their seats.

Formal Compering Workshop

<u>21st Jul</u> 18

The Students' Council organized a **Formal Compering Workshop** for students on 21st July 2018 from 10:00am to 11:30 am. The resource person for the workshop was **Mr. John Silveira, certified international trainer, State Coordinator, National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF)**. The programme commenced with the introduction and formal welcome.



The resource person, Mr. John Silveira introduced the topic 'Art of Compering' as a specialized form of compering which requires specialized skills. He explained how to start a speech in a different way like with a quote. Before preparation, important things to be kept in mind are: the nature of the function, type of audience, time duration and the time of start. Also, important suggestions to keep in mind are that different organizations have different protocol; mobile phone should be off, modulation of voice and being in charge of

the event. He emphasized that a Master of Ceremonies should have a detailed time bound agenda, invitation copy and list of VVIP's and should see to the arrangements like convenient seats, enough light, microphone, mineral water and name board.

Further, he discussed important do's and don'ts that a MC should be involved with in preparing his speech and seeing to the arrangements. Some of the important do's are - checking everything beforehand, preparing a powerful opening, addressing the dignitaries with respect, pronouncing names correctly, ensuring all presentations and equipment are in working condition, introducing the guests in a befitting manner and ending on a positive note. Some of the important don'ts in compering are - avoiding negative comments in a speech, having a long opening, moving around here and there, fiddling with things on a table and keeping mobile close to the microphone. The importance of voice modulation and pausing were also highlighted with real life examples. Some tips for the introduction were given like biodata should be collected in advance, keeping it brief and impressive, avoid getting personal and mention abbreviations properly.
