


NCC Army Wing Camp



The Resource Person for the session was Adv. Siddhi Mayur Parodkar, Practicing Advocate at High Court of Bombay at Goa. The objective of the session was to highlight the importance of ethics and social justice in daily life.

The session began with an introduction of the

Resource Person by Miss Sidhi Kerwadiker, student of FY B.Com. The Convener of the Life Skills Committee, Ms. Marjina Shaikh gave a brief overview of the topic. The Resource Person began the session with an explanation on what ethics are and how ethics help to become a good citizen. She then explained the students that being ethical means to be honest, considerate and listening to one's inner conscious while solving ethical problems encountered during daily lives. Security schemes of government to bring economically weaker sections at par were also discussed.

The Resource Person also covered the following topics:

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- 3. The Principles of social justice

- 5. Why has social justice gained importance?

 - **ii. Akanksha & Akshaya:** The two sisters run a home based baking business hailing from Vasco. They have been baking for over two years and have invented more than 100 customized cakes. The pandemic bought an opportunity to start their own business. She caters to orders from Pilar, Miramar, Panjim and Margao.


The Women's Cell members distributed garam masala packet and chocolate mousse cake to all staff members as a promotional activity.

The session was organized virtually through Google Meet on 8th March, 2022 from 12:30 pm to 1:30 p.m. The Resource Person for the session was Mr. Pravin Pai Kakode, Executive Director, Upgrade Enterprises Pvt Ltd. The session was attended by 57 students. The session was

organized with an objective of creating an interest in entrepreneurship among the students and helping them to shed their inhibitions so that they would think about taking up entrepreneurship in the future.

Asst. Prof. Sheryl Sanches, Convener, Career Cell, welcomed the Resource Person and the students. Ms. Koel Jana, student of FY B.Com C introduced the Speaker. Mr. Pravin Kakode began the session with the quote 'Set a goal so big, you cant achieve it. Until you grow into the person who can achieve it.' He gave certain basic rules for Entrepreneurship#ZaynaAsheKaiNA, Management by common sense, Choice between what is easy and what is right.

Mr. Kakode stressed the importance of the customer in the business and expressed that the needs and wants of the customer are of utmost priority in business. A business can be successful only if it ensures to satisfy customers' needs and wants.

He stated that we all have limited resources and unlimited avenues. As an entrepreneur, one needs to learn to work with a team. The objective should be to achieve terrific results, while having fun.

Mr. Kakode shared various thoughts with the students such as: lead by example, focus on solutions and not on issues and not at all on people involved in the issue, catch people doing the right things, unlearning, honest relationships, success belongs to the entrepreneur and the team, make mistakes and make new ones, individual thinking v/s team thinking, none above organization, accept and respect the differences, observe, copy, homologate and apply.

Students were given a few tips to develop an entrepreneurial spirit such as: Learning through various sources such as MOOCS, take up part time jobs for the purpose of exposure, build your network, build resilience, work on agility and flexibility and fail fast. They were also advised about three key life skills i.e. Interpersonal skills, Priority Management and Money Management. The students gained immensely from the session.  - Decide the size of your emergency fund
 - Identify highly liquid saving products
 - Create a financial plan to build your emergency fund
- 7) Insurance plans
- 8) SMART financial goals
- 9) Simple and optimal investing strategies

The Webinar also laid emphasis on how to become financially independent? How much money do you need to

be financially independent? How do you plan for financial independence to retire early? What are the benefits of financial independence? and How do you achieve financial success?





12th March 2022





National Webinar on 'Artificial Intelligence in Finance: Exploring the Paradigms'

The BBA(Financial Services) Department organized a National Webinar on 'Artificial Intelligence in Finance: Exploring Paradigms'. The Webinar was organized in association with the Goa Management Association (GMA) as the first activity under the recent MoU between the College and the Goa Management Association. Renowned FinTech expert Mr. Debashish Bose, Managing Director - Public Equities, Oaks Asset Management Private Limited, was the Resource Person for the Webinar. The

Webinar was organized on 15th March 2022 from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. virtually through Google Meet Platform. A total of 235 participants attended the Webinar wherein 89 participants attended virtually while146 participants attended the through live screening in the BBA(FS) classrooms. The objective of the Webinar was to create awareness and discussion on the contemporary and anticipatory paradigms of Artificial Intelligence in Finance.

The Webinar commenced with the Welcome Address by Mr. Deepak Bandekar, Vice-Chairman of the Goa Management Association followed by a brief overview by the Principal of the College, Prof. Dr. Prita D.


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Mallya. Asst. Prof. Ashwini Devari introduced the Resource Person Mr. Debashish Bose.

Mr. Bose, while addressing the participants demonstrating the fundamental differences between artificial intelligence and natural intelligence by providing the examples of artificial intelligence applications like advanced web search engines, recommendation systems, human speech recognition, self-driving cars, automated decision-making and strategic gaming. He stated that machine learning has dominated the applications of artificial intelligence, and it has proven to be highly successful, helping to solve many challenging problems throughout industry and academia. He highlighted that artificial intelligence draws upon computer science, psychology, linguistics, philosophy, and many other fields.

Mr. Bose mentioned that the researchers and practitioners of artificial intelligence have adapted and integrated a wide range of problem-solving techniques that are of paramount significance in finance, prime ones being search and mathematical optimizations, formal logic, artificial neural networks, and methods based on statistics, probability and economics. He further explained the existing and emerging artificial intelligence technologies and trends in several domains of finance like risk assessment and management, fraud detection, management and prevention, credit decisions, financial advisory services, trading, managing finances - personalized banking, preventing cyber attacks, prediction and assessment of loan risks, enabling 24/7 customer interactions, reducing the need for repetitive work/process automation, reducing false positives and human error, ability to execute tasks of any length, making smart underwriting decisions and saving money. He concluded by mentioning the opportunities and challenges of artificial intelligence in finance.

The Webinar was very interactive; there being several questions put forth by the participants during the Question and Answer Session. The speaker addressed all the questions raised of the participants. Asst. Prof. Mayuresh Adsul moderated the question and answer session. Asst. Prof. Racheal Goes compered the Webinar while Asst. Ms Cinola Vaz, BBA(FS) Prograame Coordinator proposed the Vote of Thanks. Asst. Prof. Ashwini Devari and Asst. Prof. Snehal Alve were the faculty in-charge of the Webinar. All the participants were provided system-generated e-certificates after the submission of virtual feedback form. Participants were asked to introduce themselves by drawing something that will best describe them and were asked to explain why they think so. This activity was followed by group formation, sharing of the real-life instances when participants exhibited creativity and were encouraged to share their stories.



Day 2- commenced with the activities on creative thinking followed by the identification of reasons which stops anyone from being creative. She introduced breathing & relaxing exercises, meditation, NLP (Neuro-linguistic Programming) - a pseudoscientific approach to communication, personal development, through various activities. The meditation definitely saw a visible change in the participants' state of mind. Students agreed that they feel much calmer and relaxed. They were asked to think of an achievable goal followed by writing down

the steps to achieve it and were asked to analyze the identified steps critically. She further introduced the concepts of lateral thinking, vertical thinking and how mind operates through patterns. The session concluded with the formation of six new groups, and sharing of stories when lateral thinking was put in use by the participants.

Day 3 - two new techniques of lateral thinking, namely, generation of alternatives and challenging the assumption, were introduced and were explained to the participants through activities. They were asked to discuss among their group members to conceptualize a creative project and present the same on the next day. They were also asked to create useful and creative model.

Day 4- began with the introduction of the remaining techniques of lateral thinking, viz. suspended judgment, design, innovation, dominant idea & crucial factor. Participants were asked to draw and sketch their dream college on the chart paper and to present it. Resource Person also explained the concepts of 'Six Thinking Hats'

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and 'Mind mapping' through various activities by outlining their pros and cons.

Day 5 - all the groups were asked to present their creative models along with the explanation on the techniques used while conceptualizing and designing these models. Lastly, a Valedictory function was organized wherein Principal Dr. Prita D. Mallya thanked the Resource Person and presented a memento as a token of appreciation. Post-Valedictory, an assessment was conducted by the Resource Person to quantify the learning of the workshop. The workshop concluded after the assessment process on the thanking note.

The overall feedback for the session was positive and quite encouraging. Participants suggested to organize similar workshop in the area of Time and Stress management, Goal planning, Teamwork and leadership. Approximately, 65% students have mentioned that this workshop has met their expectation level and 70% has mentioned that their thinking ability has improved significantly. This workshop was well received by the students and e-certificates were issued to them post-completion. Inaugural session was compered by Assistant Professor Ms. Sweta Verenkar and session and Valedictory function was compered by Assistant Professor Ms. Nishigandha Naik.

Celebrating Science - Science Lecture Series 2022

Vidya Vikas Mandal's Shree Damodar College of Commerce & Economics, Margao in association with Goa State Higher Education Council, Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of Goa and Science Colleges in Goa organised 'CELEBRATING SCIENCE - SCIENCE LECTURE SERIES 2022' on 15th March 2022 from 10.30am onwards in Room no.214. 123 students and 4 faculty members attended the session. The Resource Person for the session was Dr. Bhanumati Pilli,Dept. of Geography, Parvatibai Chowgule College of Arts and Science (Autonomous), Margao.

The session began with the Welcome Address and introduction of the event by Principal Dr. Prita D Mallya. This was followed by introduction of the Chief Guest Dr Bhanumati Pilli, by the Vice-Principal and Event Coordinator, Dr. Rodney D'Silva.

Dr Bhanumati Pilli, in her address, explained the concepts of Environmental Determinism, Climatic Determinism, Atmosphere, Climate and Weather very lucidly, with examples. She also explained the concepts of Internal Heat – Metabolism, Heat gain from external sources and Heat loss. She emphasized on the importance of Perspiration - evaporation of moisture from the skin surface which is a Physiological response for maintenance of body temperature calls for a balance between body heat loss and heat gain.

The important concept of Hypothermia was explained as a condition that occurs when the core body temperature is either reduced or increased beyond a manageable range.



Collection and distribution of items (Community Service)


19th March 2022




The programme began with a melodious


