
The Post-Graduate Department of Commerce (M.Com) organized a 30-Hours Certificate Course in 'Practical Aspects of Business Accounting, Income Tax and Stock Market Operations' for the M.Com students, in order to combine the theoretical knowledge of the subjects with the practical aspects of it. The sessions were held from 06^{th} April 2022 – 07^{th} May 2022 in hybrid mode.

The first Speaker CA Dhanashree Prabhukhanolkar covered the topics – maintaining tally for small and medium businesses, Income tax exemptions and deductions for individuals, TDS, advance tax and filing of ITR 1, Practical uses of various types of ITR, Advanced Excel and GST registration, return filing and invoicing.

The second Speaker Mr Purv Shah BSE Trainer covered the topics - Basics of portfolio management and

strategies, Exchange traded derivatives, Comparison between investment and trading in equities, technical and fundamental analysis for beginners, asset classes and their cross comparison.

Each speaker was allotted 15-hours each for their topic and discussion. It was an informative and insightful course and the students also provided a positive feedback about the course. 50 students attended the course. The students were also awarded certificates on successful completion of the course.



The College organized 30 Hours Certificate Course in "MS-EXCEL IN ACCOUNTING AND FINANCE" from 08th April 2022 till 20th May, 2022 in room no. 105 from 12:30 till 1:30 p.m. this course was held for Second year BBA(FS) and B.Com students during the even semester of the academic year 2021-2022. The Resource Person for the session was CA. Prasheel Kamat

The course was conducted by the Departments with the following objectives:

- 1. To enhance the knowledge of the students by focusing on the related practical aspects.

Guest Lecture in Accounting II – DSE 7



18th April 2022

The Department of Commerce & Management organized a Guest Lecture in the subject Accounting II - DSE 7 for the Accounting specialization students of TY B.Com. The Resource Person for the session was CA Saish Naik, R.K. Pikale & Associates, Chartered Accountants. The session was held on 18th April 2022 in Room no. 101 from 1.40 to 2.35 pm. The topic of the session was Liquidation of Companies. The session began with the introduction of the Resource Person by Mr. Jackson

Rodrigues, student of TYB.Com B. Mr. Naik began the session by explaining the case of Kingfisher i.e. United Breweries Group. He elaborately discussed the case of the 7000 crore loan borrowed by United Breweries Group from 17 banks. He then discussed the difference between a Code and an Act and explained the Insolvency Bankruptcy Code.

Further, the difference between bankruptcy and liquidation was explained. He then discussed various concepts such as corporate debtor, corporate applicant, financial creditor, operational creditor and so on. Also, Fastrack liquidation and Voluntary liquidation was explained along with the authorities and the structure of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2016. Mr. Naik then discussed the Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process and also the events that trigger liquidation. Lastly, the priority of claims in the event of liquidation was explicated.

The session was well appreciated by the students. 42 students attended the session. Ms. Tejasvi Patil from TY B.Com C proposed the Vote of Thanks. The Faculty in-charge for the session were Dr. Maithili Naik and Ms. Sheryl Sanches.



Accounting for the students of SY B.Com. The Resource Person for the session was Mr Bodila, Certified Corporate Trainer, Business Coach & HR Consultant. The session was held on 18th April 2022 in online mode through zoom from 10.00 to 11.30 am. The topic of the session was Financial Wellness Enhancement. The session began with the introduction of the Resource Person by Ms. Minoska Fernandes, student of SY B.Com A. Mr. Bodila began the session by discussing about how one should take control over financial future. In general, people subtract their mandatory outflows and expenses from their income and the balance is then saved. But ideally, the mandatory outflows and savings should first be kept aside and then the expenses can be adjusted accordingly. Later the concept of inflation was explained using relevant examples of investing in a

fixed deposit that provides an interest rate that is less than the inflation rate.

With appropriate examples, the concept of compounding interest was explained. Appropriate investment classes were discussed that help beat inflation and also are tax deductible. Mutual Funds as an investment avenue was explained with a detail of what to check while investing in mutual funds such as its returns, expense ratio, portfolio composition, size of the fund, category, investment blend etc. Students were also taught how to map the mutual funds to your goals.

The Resource Person then answered various queries put forth by the students regarding investment in the stock market. The session was well appreciated by the students. 65 students of SY B.Com attended the session. Ms. Madhuri Sharma from SY B.Com A proposed the Vote of Thanks.

Soft Skills Training



20th to 29th April & 6th to 11 May 2022

The Placement Cell organized Soft Skills training program, for the registered students of the Placement Cell across all programs of the College. The program was conducted in two batches through hybrid mode. The first batch was from 20th to 29th April 2022 and the second batch was from 06th to 11th May 2022. The Resource Person for the program was Ms. Caroline Stewart Silva.

Ms. Silva intensively covered a total of five modules, based on Soft Skills, which were,

a) Art of communication and listening skills, b) Conflict management, c) Teamwork and interpersonal skills, d) Time management, and e) Business/ email/ social media etiquette, for the training period.

The introductory session – Module 1, encompassed the Art of Communication and Listening Skills, wherein topics like the meaning of verbal and para verbal communication, 7 C's of communication, process, barriers, and tips to overcome such barriers were extensively taught to the students. Students were also enlightened by the Resource Person's expert knowledge of listening skills, wherein she stressed the importance of active listening.

The following session – Module 2 was on Conflict Management, wherein Ms. Silva discussed the meaning, types, and reasons for conflicts. She stressed the techniques to manage conflicts like competing, accommodating, avoiding, collaborating and compromising. She also emphasized the importance of the role of attitude and concluded her session on the module with the help of two case studies.

The next session – Module 3 was pertaining to Teamwork and Interpersonal Skills. Ms. Silva began the session by introducing the concept of interpersonal skills and went on to discuss the tips to improve interpersonal skills like having empathy, not complaining, asking for yourself, being open, being tactful, etc. She also emphasized the importance of teamwork and the stages of team management – forming, storming, norming, and performing. Ms. Silva tactfully conducted this session with the help of some activities.

The subsequent session - Module 4 was on Time management. Ms. Silva began the session with an activity,

wherein she managed to highlight the significance of time management. She stressed areas such as time versus task management, misconceptions about time management, and the importance of doing things right, not fast. She also shared tips on things to be done in situations when there are too many tasks on schedule, like assigning a time limit to each task, do not procrastinate, having a direction, organizing, recording daily activities, etc. She concluded the session by sharing an inspirational story on time management.

The final session – Module 5 encompassed Business/ Email/ Social Media Etiquettes. Ms. Silva, in this session, stressed the Do's and Don't s, in business, while composing and writing an email, and different types of etiquette, like punctuality, business card protocols, email etiquette, meeting etiquette, dining etiquette, online etiquette (netiquette), etc. She also shared useful tips on dressing for a business meeting, an interview, and the like. She concluded this session with a quiz.

87 registered students of the Placement Cell across all programs attended the training. The entire training by Ms. Caroline Stewart Silva was highly interactive and enriching, which has undeniably provided immense insights into the required soft skills.



Second Year B.Com students of the College on 23rd April 2022 at 12.15 pm in room no. 212. The session was conducted with an aim to provide the students with a basic understanding about research. Assistant Professor Sheryl Sanches welcomed and introduced the Resource Person Dr. Kaustubh Kamat, Assistant Director, Academics, Directorate of Higher Education.

Dr. Kaustubh Kamat began the session by explaining the concept about research. He cited very simple and basic examples to describe what is research, what is research done, what is its relevance and few basic methods of conducting research. Dr. Kamat then explained the research process in few simple steps:

- 1. Define the research problem
- 2. Review the literature (review concepts and theories and review previous research finding)
- 3. Formulate hypotheses
- 4. Design the research (including sample design)
- 5. Collect the data (execution)
- 6. Analyse the data (test the hypotheses)
- 7. Interpret and report

Further, the research design was discussed. Primary and secondary data sources, research approaches such as focus group, survey research and experimental research, questionnaire, sampling plan and various contact methods was briefly explained.

He finally summed up the session by stressing on the relevance of research. The session was well appreciated by the students. 31 students attended the session. Deepika Kholkar from SY B.Com D proposed the Vote of Thanks.

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Campus to Corporate Training



25th, 30th April & 2nd, 9th May 2022

The Placement Cell organized its preplacement 'Campus to Corporate Training' for the registered participants in two sessions on 25th, 30th April 2022 and 2nd, 9th May 2022 from 9.00 am. To 12.30 pm in Ramadas Mallya Smart Classroom and Skill Development Center respectively.The Resource Person for the first session was Trainer and Mind Coach, Ms. Priyanka Row.

The objective of the program were as follows:

1. Preparing students for Campus to Corporate Jobs transition.

2. To give inputs into writing their resumes to facing interview to learning corporate etiquette.

3. To resolve personal development issues through detailed interaction and question answers sessions.

During her two days sessions, Ms. Priyanka Row conscientiously covered a range of topics including the art and elements of first impression, how to write a good CV, skills necessary to stand out during an interview, high performance communication, power of body language, types of body postures while sitting and standing – which ones to adopt and which to avoid, types of handshakes, importance of elevator pitch, types of clothes, shoes, perfume to be perfect on the day of the interview, art of departing and most importantly how to confidently answer an interview. 
The session concluded with positive response from the students. The students clarified their doubts and showed an inclination to answer the GU-ART exam and apply for the M.Com program.



The Resource Person for the session was Mr. Shekhar Bhat, CTO, Foxberry Technologies. Session was conducted for students of all programmes. 49 students attended the session.

The session began at 12.15 pm. Mr. Shekhar Bhat stated that he completed his Engineering degree on his own without the assistance of anyone else, and also narrated a short story on how he supported his son to choose his career. The speaker touched upon some of the important topics which are essential for career of the student. This will also help them pursue their choices effectively in the future. Some of the topics discussed during the

session were Career Goal Setting, Career Planning, Self Employment, importance of Higher Education, different Career Opportunities based on their respective streams.

He also motivated the students to be visionary and focus on different opportunities available in the Commerce streams. 

He also showed the live trading and explained the students how to plan buy and sell strategies by analysis support and resistance level in a candlestick chart.


Moving further Mr. Majithia briefly explained the concepts of derivatives markets and procedure of investing in an IPO.



The participants were NSS students and NCC (Army & Navy) wing cadets of the College.

The topic of the training was "Shelter Level Training under Component C of NCRMP-II (for CSMMC Members, Disaster Management Team & Community Volunteers)". The main objective of the session was to inform the participants about the various safety measures and how to deal with casualties in the time of emergency. At the outset, Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas Course Director of GIPARD welcomed the participants and briefed about the three days training. 


