### **Awareness on Cyber Bullying Session**

3<sup>rd</sup> August 2022

The Counselling cell of the College conducted a session on cyber bullying for second year BCA students on 03<sup>rd</sup> August 2022 to create awareness regarding cyber bullying and its consequences. The session was taken by Ms. Eshani Bakhle, College counsellor.

She informed the students about what bullying is defined as, what is considered as cyber bullying and laws in India against cyber bullying. The students were given psycho education on the mental state of the bully, mental health issues faced by the victim of cyber bullying and steps taken to prevent cyber bullying. Under psycho education the students were informed about the mental health issues faced by the victims of bullying, that is, post-traumatic stress disorder, depression and anxiety. The speaker provided student with an explanation on how past experiences of a person's life can influence him/her to engage in a disruptive behaviour like bullying others.

Students were informed about anti-bullying committee of the Institution and places in Goa that provide help to the victims of cyber bullying.



The IQAC and FDP cell of the College jointly organised a 7-day Faculty Development program on the topic "Technology for Educators" in the month of August- September 2022 for all the teaching staff of the College. The Program followed a lecture-demonstration-hands-on approach for all the sessions.

### **DAY 1: 23<sup>rd</sup>& 24<sup>th</sup> August 2022** from 2:00-3:30 p.m.

A session on **Google Workspace** by **Ms. Pradnya Nadkarni**. She demonstrated various tools offered under the Google workspace, like Google calendar, Google drive, Google forms, Tasks, etc. Throughout the session,

participants tried out different features of different tools on their own and asked the Resource Person their doubts and difficulties.

On 24<sup>th</sup>, a session on **Master the Communication Processes Using Gmail** was conducted by **Ms. Pradnya Nadkarni.** Ms. Nadkarni demonstrated how to use the different features of Gmail, in detail. This included filtering emails, organising emails with labels, undoing sent emails, snoozing the emails, scheduling emails, etc. Following the same approach of the previous day of FDP, participants tried out these features on their systems and got their doubts cleared. The day ended with Vote of Thanks proposed by Swati Bhat.

### **DAY 3: 6<sup>th</sup> September 2022** from 2:00-3:30 p.m.

A session on Google Classroom by Mr. Ramkrishna Reddy. He spoke about how Google classrooms can be an effective tool for educators to manage their courses. He demonstrated how to create Google classrooms, assigning classwork, grading, and making announcements in Google classrooms, and use of tools like assignments and quizzes to achieve different tasks of an educator efficiently. He also demonstrated how to manage a Google classroom. This included copying, archiving, and deleting classrooms, removing and muting students, adding new teachers, and other classroom settings

### **DAY 4: 22<sup>nd</sup>& 24<sup>th</sup> September 2022** from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 pm.

A session on Application of Blooms Taxonomy in Teaching-Learning-Evaluation was conducted by three faculties from Chowgule College. After the welcome of guests and address by the Principal, first Resource person for the day, Prof. Nandkumar Sawant, Professor & Head, Dept. of Geography spoke about Lower order thinking skills (LOTS) and higher order thinking skills (HOTS) as per bloom's taxonomy. Dr. Nandini Vaz Fernandes, Associate Professor & Head, Dept. of Zoology engaged a session about application of blooms taxonomy using digital learning platforms. Mr. Andrew Barreto, Assistant Professor, Dept. of English engaged the final session on the topic of Blended learning platforms. He also showcased a digital portfolio of the works and projects of a student. The Resource Persons requested all the teachers to complete the tasks assigned on Google Classroom before the next session on 24<sup>th</sup> September.

On 24<sup>th</sup>, Prof. Nandkumar Sawant spoke about Academic assignment writing: formatting and rubrics. This was followed by a few participants presenting an assignment that they had designed for their own curriculum. All the participants engaged in recommending improvisations to the assignments presented. This was followed by a session by Dr. Nandini Vaz Fernandes on "Problem based learning: format and rubrics." Participants asked questions regarding the doubts that they had and got them cleared from the Resource Person. Shri. Andrew Barreto conducted the final session on "Flipped classroom."Prof. Nandkumar Sawant summarised the discussions of the day in the concluding session. The day ended with vote of thanks by Shreyas Desai.

### **DAY 6: 27<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> September** from 2:00-3:30 p.m.

A session on **Make your Information look beautiful** was taken by **Mr. Sandesh Gaundalkar** on both the days. He spoke about design and principles of design. He also demonstrated how various colour schemes should be applied in layout design. He covered typefaces and fonts, and demonstrated strengths and weaknesses of serif and sans-serif typefaces. This was followed by participants trying to redesign their syllabus powerpoint

presentations as per the principles of design discussed during the two days. The Resource person appraised their work and suggested improvements wherever applicable. The day and the FDP ended with Vote of Thanks by Shreyas Desai.

The session was chaired by Shiv Siddhant Narayan Kaul MD, Nicco Engineering Services Limited and Honorary Consul General of The Republic of Korea in Kolkata, Pranjal Sharma Author, Economic Analyst & Columnist, Shrinivas Dempo Chairman, Dempo Group of Companies &

Senior Vice President All India Management Association, Nikhil Sawhney Vice Chairman and Managing Director Triveni Turbine Limited, Director, Triveni Engineering and Industries Limited & Vice President, AIMA invited speaker were Dr K Radhakrishnan Former Chairman, Space Commission/ Secretary Department of Space & Chairman, ISRO, Mr D Shivakumar Group Executive President Strategy and Business Development Aditya Birla Group & Past President, AIMA, Ms Shereen Bhan Managing Editor CNBC-TV18, Mr Sanjiv Mehta CEO and Managing Director Hindustan Unilever Limited.

The SYMP was divided into four sessions and the first session began at 9.35 am with Dr K Radhakrishnan as the speaker and Shiv Siddhant Narayan Kaul as the session chair. The purpose of SYMP was to help young students see the world from the eyes of high achievers so that they also aspire and work towards making a big impact in the world. It was a very interactive programme where speakers were asked their views on work, career and life and also their advice on acquiring the necessary habits and attitude to become high achievers.

Dr. K. Radhakrishnan enlightened the participants by speaking about his career and space & technology and encouraged them by highlighting the opportunities available to young engineers and scientists to get into new areas of space. He encouraged young minds to continue a lifelong career in science and technology as there is ample scope for young scientists and stressed various areas where students can get into and how they can go ahead in science and technology by sharing his experience. The first session ended by thanking Dr K Radhakrishnan for motivating young minds and Shiv Siddhant Narayan Kaul for moderating the session.





'India should grow rapidly over a long period of time' says Ambassador (Retd.) Gautam Bambawale



### 17<sup>th</sup> September 2022

As part of its Golden Jubilee celebrations, VVM's Shree Damodar Collegeof Commerce & Economics, Margao had organized an address by Ambassador Gautam (Retd.) Bambawale, Former Ambassador of India to Bhutan, Pakistan and China. The eminent speaker spoke on the topic 'India in the Changing World Order. The talk was held on 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2022at 4:00 pm on Saturday in the College premises. Office bearers of Vidya Vikas Mandal President Mr Nitin Kunkolienker, First Vice President Mr

Pritam Morais along with the Principal Prof. Prita D Mallya were present for the occasion. The talk was also

attended by other dignitaries, teaching staff, students and invitees.

President Mr Nitin A. Kunkolienker welcomed the esteemed Speaker and the audience. Foregrounding the constant alteration in the geopolitical scenario, Mr. Kunkolienker expressed that everyone should be aware of these shifts and their implications for our economic and political relations with the rest of the world. Prof. Prita D Mallya while introducing the speaker said that the presence of Mr. Bambawale has added glitter to the golden jubilee celebration of the College.

Former Ambassador Gautam Bambawale began his address by congratulating the institution for reaching the historic milestone of 50 years. He wished the College well for the forthcoming years, and said that there is a lot to be done as the College is marching towards its centenary year. Mr Bambawale eloquently touched upon the geopolitical as well as geo-economic phenomena around the world and how they impact India.

Starting with Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the learned speaker said that Russia like any other country, reacted to the threat that they faced from NATO. No country would remain indifferent to what might be a missile attack which could be facilitated from neighbouring countries. Moscow took military action against Ukraine, only to protectits national sovereignty. Making several points to highlight the strategic positioning of our country in the Russia- Ukraine war, Mr Bambawale said India and Russia share a very special relationship, which covers military hardware, nuclear commerce and space cooperation. Another component of this relationship is the oil and gas imports from Russia. Considering all these factors, India stood by Russia; however PM Modi didn't hesitate to repeatedly call for a halt to bloodshed, so as to give diplomacy a chance. This stand is testimony to the fact that in international matters, India takes its own position in the interest of its country and its citizens, and does not bow to international pressure. Recalling the Chinese attempts to make alterations on the Ladhak frontiers, he said that the Indian military could thwart China on the eastern frontiers. However, an important lesson from this incident is that India needs to grow more powerful and enhance its comprehensive national power to protect itself.

The Speaker then drew attention to the more critical trend in geopolitics viz. the rise of China. Former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi's visit to China boosted not only trade between the two but also ensured peace at the borders. Over the last few decades, China with her increasing economic power, has become US's most potent competitor. Most countries including India chose to sit on the fence and watch. But as far as India was concerned, things changed dramatically in April – May 2020 when Beijing moved large numbers of troops to the border with India at Eastern Ladakh, said Mr Bambawale. Since then, there have been increasing tensions at the border and the blame lies entirely at China's door. This flexing of muscles by China has brought India closer to Japan, Australia, UK and France in terms of international relations.

Analyzing all these aspects of the geopolitical scenario, the worthy speaker argued that India needs to fight China on its own, and should not expect assistance from other nations. Elaborating of the course of action India should be taking, the speaker said "we must realize that we need to build India's military strength as well as our economic strength. They go hand in hand". We must achieve high annual rates of GDP growth - at least 7-8% over an extended period of time of over 20 or 25 years. It is also essential that we enhance our spending on defence and military preparedness from the current 1.2 per cent of GDP to about 2 per cent of GDP.

One way India is signalling its unhappiness with China about its aggressive behaviour, is by banning Chinese apps. He also urged the audience to avoid buying Chinese products, despite the fact that they are cheaper - "we can accept this pain in order for our country to gain." Shedding some light on the attempt of the Indian government to promote *aatmanirbharta*in the pharmaceutical sector, he said this will help us to be less dependent on China for raw materials. India also needs to develop more reliable and resilient supply chains.

Summing up his address, Mr. Bambawale stated that India needs to strengthen its international ties with countries on China's borders and other countries of the region. For this to materialize, our international stature will depend on how strong we are internally and domestically. Only this will help reduce the asymmetry that exists between India and China.

The talk culminated with the First Vice-President, Adv. Pritam Morais proposing the Vote of Thanks and everyone singing the National Anthem.

basis and Fixtures was designed by putting lots. All the matches were played with time limit of 10 minutes each



The Orientation was a great experience for students as they got valuable information about the civil service exam. Altogether 103 students attended the programme.




