Peripatetic Training Programme on Establishment Rules including Reservation in Services

28th to 30th November 2022



GIPARD organized a 3 Day Peripatetic Training Programme from 28th to 30th November 2022 at GIPARD, Ella Farm, Old Goa. The Resource Persons were Mr. Naresh Bharadwaj, Joint Director, Institute of Secretarial Training & Management, New Delhi and Mr. R. D. Talukdar, Director, Department of Expenditure, GoI.

Mr. Naresh Bharadwaj commenced the session. He explained about framing and amending of RRs. He showed the participants a basic format to be used for this. He also explained importance of Probation

on recruitment and different criteria to be considered before confirmation.

After the lunch break Mr. R.D Talukdar explained about principles of Seniority and Departmental Promotion Committee (DPC) Procedures, Checklist for promotion, Types of promotion, Benchmark grades required for every promotion, Zone of Consideration, Formula for calculation of promotion vacancies.

On the 2nd day i.e. 29th November 2022, Mr. Bharadwaj elaborated on Reservation in Services- Constitutional provisions, Article 16 clause and amendments, scrutiny of Caste Certificate and effect of Migration, Conversion, Marriage and Adoption, Post-based Rosters - RK Sabharwal Judgement, writing TALLY on Rosters, etc.

Post lunch Mr. Talukdar engaged a session on Preparation, Maintenance and Operation of Roster, L-Shaped Roster -Operations and Maintenance, Number of Rosters to be maintained and how to calculate percentage of reservation.

On Day 3, i.e. 30th November 2022, Mr. Talukdar explained Horizontal Reservation for Persons with Disabilities and Mr. Bharadwaj explained Reservation in Direct Recruitment - Concept of "Own Merit", preparation of Merit List and Reservation in Promotion and how backlog vacancies are to be identified and advertised.

The sessions were very informative. After every session, there were exercises given to be solved which included practical workplace examples. Ms. Nikhita Mayekar, Jr. Stenographer attended the training programme.

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Leader Talks by GMA




30th November 2022

The PG Department of Commerce in association with the Alumni Engagement Cell organized Alumni Reconnect Series-5 Session on 'Depository and its Functioning' on 1st December 2022. The Resource Persons for the session were Mr. Ameet Pinto and Mr. Sunit Pinto, Partners, SA Financial Services, Margao. The main objective of the session was to provide detailed and practical overview of depository services in India. Ms. Valencia Baptista, Asst. Prof. in Commerce welcomed the audience and gave a brief overview of the

importance of the session. Ms. Priyanka Mitra from M.Com Part I introduced the Resource Person.

Mr. Ameet Pinto began the session with an overview of depositories by explaining about the reforms in the Indian securities market with the creation of SEBI, screen-based trading system of NSE, the T+2 Day settlement system and clearing corporations. He also described 'depository' and compared it to banks with an example. He explained why dematerialization was necessary and the benefits of availing depository system with the elimination of bad deliveries, forgeries, loss of certificate, reduced paperwork and so much more. He spoke about the services offered by the depository and how to open a Demat account by providing PAN card, Proof of identity, Proof of address and bank details. He also said that there can be up to 3 nominees for the nomination of a Demat account.

Thereafter, Mr. Sunit Pinto took over the session. He showed the audience a video on how the Speed-E system works and also the IDeAS system which is an internet-based Demat account statement. He also provided information about a certificate course for an individual to act as a Depository Participant that is valid for 3 years along with other such courses in this field.

Before the session concluded, there were questions posed by the audience that the Resource Persons answered willingly. The Vote of Thanks was given by Ms. Uma Pandit of M.Com-I and the session ended at 12:40pm. 35 students from M.Com Part I attended the session.

Session on Secondary Data Sources



2nd December 2022

The RDI Cell, Department of Library and Information Science, and FDP Cell of the College jointly organized a session on the topic "Secondary Data Sources", on 2nd December 2022 for all the teaching staff of the College. The Resource Person for the session was Dr. Sandhya Krishnan, Assistant Professor, SAMSOE, NMIMS. The Resource Person addressed the participants through video conferencing, while the participants were seated in the Smart classroom where they could see the Resource Person and her presentation. 42 faculties attended.

Vice Principal, Dr. Edwin Barreto welcomed Dr. Sandhya and the participants at the beginning of the session. Ms. Manasi Rege introduced the Resource Person to the participants.

Dr. Sandhya spoke about various online sources of secondary data that the faculties can make use of for their research purpose. She also spoke about different ways in which data is structured, such as cross section, time series, panel data, and pooled cross section data. She then spoke about the differences between primary and secondary data sources before proceeding to the main topic of the session.

She guided the faculty about the data sources for various fields like finance and economics, social sector, government sector, as well as for the worldwide data. For every sector/field, she spoke about the sources that provide data for free and which are paid. She also showed on the screen the details of the actual data that is presently available on the websites of many such sources.

The session was compered by Mr. Shreyas Desai, and Vote of Thanks was proposed by Dr. Maithili Naik. The session was coordinated by Dr. Maithili Naik, Convenor of RDI Cell, Ms. Swati Bhat, Convenor of FDP Cell, and Ms. Manasi Rege, Librarian, Department of Library and Information Sciences. The PG Department of Commerce organized an Industry Interaction Programme (IIP) Series-1 Session on 'Decoding Goa IT Inc.' The Resource Person was Mr. Mangirish Salelkar, CEO and Co-Founder of UMANG Group. The main objective of the session was to provide an overview and current position of the IT Industry in Goa. Mr. Myron Pereira, Asst. Prof. in Commerce welcomed the Resource Person and gave a brief overview of the importance of the session. Ms. Valerie Viegas from M.Com Part I introduced the Resource Person.

Mr. Mangirish Salelkar began the session by giving a brief overview of the IT Industry in Goa and the number of IT Companies functioning in Goa. He differentiated between the concepts of Digitalization (moving from offline to online or automation of processes) and Digitization (conversion of physical records or data into digital form). He spoke about the Government schemes available to finance a startup idea in IT sector and also spoke about the concepts of mergers and acquisition as a solution for growth. Thereafter, he discussed about the problems and challenges faced by the IT Industry during the Covid and Post-Covid Period. Since most of the companies switched to work from home, the UMANG Group came up with a solution called UPSTAX. As the economy was forced to automate all data, records and accounts into electronic form, it contributed to the growth of the IT Industry. Mr. Mangirish concluded the session by saying, 'Post pandemic, the Tech Industry in Goa is growing at a rapid pace, the local ecosystem is very supportive and encouraging. Government, Academia and Industry are in sync to uplift the IT Industry.'

The session was very interactive, where the students posed various queries and cleared various doubts through the expert answers given by the Resource Person. The Vote of Thanks was given by Ms. Roshni Khatun of M.Com-I and the session ended at 1.00 pm. 65 students from M.Com Part I and II attended the session.

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DoPT, GOI Sponsored Training Programme organized by GIPARD on "Issues Relating to Family Welfare"



7th to 9th December 2022

The DoPT, GOI sponsored training programme on 'Issues relating to Family Welfare' was held from 07th to 09th December 2022 from 10.00 am-5.00pm in the Conference Hall, Goa Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development, Ella Farm Old Goa. The aim of the training programme was to impart knowledge to the participants on the various aspects of family welfare for a healthy and happy family.

Day 1 – 7th December 2022

On the first day, Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas, Course Director and Core Faculty- Women's Development, GIPARD welcomed all the participants and inaugurated the session. She gave a brief overview about the 3 days training programme and discussed its objectives and expected outcomes.

The first session was from 10:15 am – 1:15 pm. The speaker for the session was Dr. Kunda Silimkhan. Dr. Silimkhan is a retired physician and a yoga practitioner. The topic for the session was 'Happy Family: Family as protection unit of society'. Dr. Silimkhan introduced the concept of the holistic well-being of the family, the various issues that affect the well-being of a family and discussed various approaches for ensuring a happy and healthy family. Dr. Silimkhan spoke about different ways of managing stress for a healthy family through self-awareness, identifying warning signs, managing time, balancing work and personal life, using assertive communication, making realistic commitments, overcoming co-dependency, and sharing family activities.

The next session was from 2.00 pm - 5.00 pm. The topic for the session was legislative protection for the family (for women, children, and the aged parents) by Adv. Caroline Collaso. The Resource Person briefed the participants on the major provisions of Maintenance & Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 and Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act 2005. The grounds for the award of maintenance under these acts were explained as well. At the end of the session, the Resource Person informed the participants about various NGOs, Rehabilitation centres and support groups available in Goa for public assistance.

Day 2 - 8th December 2022

The session on the second day began at 10.00 am. The Resource Person was Dr. Ira Almeida, Rtd. Senior Paediatrician and Ex. Director Public Health DHS. The topic for the session was orientation on disabilities in children (physical, audio, visual etc.) and various schemes for the differently abled.

Dr. Ira's session mainly focused on maintaining the physical health of the family. She informed the audience on the difference that exists between disability, impairment and begin handicap. She mentioned the causes of disabilities among children at the prenatal and post-natal stages and further elaborated on the common pre-natal causes of disabilities which are iron deficiency, substance use, lifestyle diseases and stress. The importance of immunization to prevent post-natal disabilities was highlighted as well. Dr. Ira concluded the session by informing the audience about various schemes available to persons with disabilities and NGOs that support the families of persons with disabilities. The session ended at 11.30 am.

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The second session for the day was by Dr. Jose Noronha, Faculty SEA SCAN Academy and Faculty Kamaxidevi Homoepathic Medical College, Shiroda. The session commenced at 11.30 am. Dr. Noronha highlighted the importance of maintaining personal health hygiene and the need for education in sanitation. He mentioned some of the effective home remedies to treat common illnesses like flu, diarrhoea, allergy and worm-related infections. The session ended at 3.30 pm.

The third session for the day began at 3.45 pm and the resource person for the same was Ms. Rohini Diniz, Consultant, Nutritionist & Dietician. Dr. Diniz spoke on healthy cooking practices, nutrition and diet at all stages of life. She highlighted the correct methods and techniques of cooking thus maintaining all its nutritional value and enhancing food properties while cooking. The session ended at 5.00pm.

Day 3 – 9th December 2022

The first Resource Person for the session was Dr. Sylvia Mascarenhas, Practicing Psychologist Healthway Hospital. The session commenced at 10.00 am. She spoke about mental health problems and issues of concern affecting families and the different ways to deal with them. She stressed on having effective and regular communication with family members to maintain healthy relationship. Further Dr. Sylvia informed the audience about the impact of these problems on the family and children. The session ended at 1.15 pm. with an exercise on practicing self-care.

The 3-day workshop ended with evaluation and valediction by Ms. Arlette Mascarenhas. Ms. Pooja Shanbhag, Asst. Prof in Commerce and Ms. Eshani Bakhle College Counsellor attended the session. 33 faculties from various departments / institutions attended the training program. Overall it was a very interesting, beneficial and an informative training programme.

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49 M.Com and PGDFT students of the College went for a study tour to Gujarat organized by the Post Graduate Department of Commerce. The students were accompanied by 4 faculty members: Ms. Twinkle Fernandes, Ms. Valencia Baptista, Mr. Myron Pereira and Ms. Edrea Picardo and a tour guide, Mr. Amit Samant from Ashtavinayak Travels.

The journey to Gujarat commenced on 7th December via train from Margao to Ahmedabad. The tour group arrived at the Ahmedabad Railway Station on 8th December at 7:30 a.m. and thereafter, lodged at Hotel SK Lords Inn, Ahmedabad.

On Day 1, i.e. 8th December, the tour group visited the Vikram Sarabhai Space Exhibition Centre, Ahmedabad. It is the space centre of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) focusing on rocket and space vehicles for India's satellite programme. A model of a satellite launcher at the entrance of the Centre fascinated all the students. A documentary on the process of launching of Space Crafts and the activities of astronauts in space ship was shown to the students. The mechanism of launching of satellites was also explained by their Resource Persons through LED screen.

Post lunch, the students were taken to Swaminarayan Akshardham Temple, Gandhinagar. This temple is a tribute to Swami Narayanan, a benign spirit and also to his teachings. The calm and serene atmosphere of the temple filled everyone with a renewed energy. Beautiful and well maintained park inside the premises are amazing and extremely spectacular. The artifacts are well designed and beautiful, especially the golden statue and the paintings depicting the life of Swaminarayan.

Thereafter, the tour group was directed by the tour guide towards the laser show. The laser show depicted the story of Nachiketa who triumphs against death. The show beautifully depicted Nachiketa's viewpoints and conversations with his father and his encounters with Yamraj, the God of Death. The students enjoyed the spectacular laser show with multi effects of water, fire, lights, drama and sounds. Thereafter, the group proceeded towards the Hotel for dinner and Night Halt.

On Day 2 i.e. 9th December, after breakfast at the hotel, the tour group reached the first spot of the day i.e. Sun Temple, Modhera at 12.15 pm. The guide at sun temple enriched the students with lot of information about the significance of the temple, its wall carvings depicting the stories of Ramayana and the Step well in the Temple's Premises, which had carved sculptures of 108 Gods.

The next visit was at Rani ki Vav at Patan, which was constructed by Queen Udayamati in the memory of her late husband King Bhima I. The tour guide there gave lot of information about the historic monument. Rani ki Vav has been declared a Monument of National Importance and has been listed as one of the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Since July 2018, the Rs.100 Banknote of Mahatma Gandhi New Series features Rani Ki Vav on the reverse. Thereafter, the group headed for lunch at a restaurant. Post lunch and after a long journey, the group reached the hotel at 7.30 pm. Post dinner, the group went for shopping on the streets of Ahmedabad and subsequently, halted at the hotel for night.

On Day 3, i.e. 10th December, the group checked out at the Hotel and visited the first destination of the day, Hutheesing Jain Temple, Ahmedabad. It was a calm and peaceful place with beautiful architecture. The Priests were conducting their morning rituals and devotees were seeking blessings of Bhagwan Mahavir.

The next destination was Sabarmati Ashram, Ahmedabad. This was one of the many residences of Mahatma Gandhi, where he lived for twelve years with his wife Kasturba Gandhi and followers. The ashram has a museum depicting the rich history of Gandhi's naming practices. The 3D Painting of Dandi March or the Salt Satyagraha, Charkha and table used by Gandhiji to spin khadi, three wise monkeys of Gandhiji and Statue of Gandhiji in the garden were some of the features of the Museum.

Post lunch, the group visited Amul Milk Factory, Anand at 2.00 pm. The Person Incharge of Production unit

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explained the production processing and packaging of Amul Butter through live processes using various machines and assembly lines in the premises of the Factory Unit.


