### **Training Sessions for IRDA Examinations**

11,15 October 2023 & 3 February 2024

The Department of Management Studies organized Training Sessions for IRDA Examinations for the students of SY BBA(FS). The Resource Person was Mr. Nixon Fernandes, Development Officer, LIC. The first session was held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023 in Room F401, the second session was held on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2023 in Smart classroom and the final session was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2024 - Room F401.

Ms. Delisha Rebello, Asst. Professor introduced the Resource Person and Ms. Sushrusha Naik Khandekar gave the highlights of the training programme. In his first session, Mr. Fernandes familiarised the students with the fundamentals of Insurance and discussed the challenges and opportunities for the insurance industry in India. The second session focused on practical aspects such as the practice of insurance through an agency and its license requirements, career opportunities for students in the life insurance sector and the regulatory framework of IRDA.



The third session focused on the procedure for applying for the IRDA examination, documents required, and the fee structure. Through all the three sessions, important contents from the syllabus were discussed and necessary guidance was provided to the students. Mr. Fernandes also shared the handout of study materials with the students for preparation for the IRDA examinations. The sessions were attended by students of SY BBA(FS) A&B. Faculty coordinators of the training programme were Asst. Professors Ms. Delisha Rebello and Ms. Sushrusha Naik Khandekar. Ms. Nitya Bhat, student from SY BBA(FS)A, proposed the Vote of Thanks. lots. All preliminary matches were played to 21 points in 1 set, while the finals were played to 11 points in 3 sets.



### PG Club Activity: "Key Highlights of Union Budget 2024-2025"

### 1st February 2024



The Post Graduate Department of Commerce conducted live screening session on the Interim Union Budget for the students of M.Com Part I and II on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024. The live session was screened in the classroom T-304. The purpose of screening the session was to make the students aware about the upcoming budget. The session started at 11.05 am with the Head of the Department, Ms Twinkle Fernandes

greeting the students and giving them a small insight on the budget.

The live session started with the Finance Minister, Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman giving a brief report on the current economic status of India. The interim budget 2024 lays a solid foundation for Viksit Bharat, affirming the government's vision of building a prosperous Bharat in harmony with nature, modern infrastructure and opportunities for all. It promises to empower the four vulnerable sections of society - the poor, the youth, farmers, and women folk, in order to realise India's potential.

Promoting sustainable development in India has been the top-of-mind strategy of the Amrit Kaal wherein bold action towards climate change for realising our commitment to becoming 'net-zero' by 2070 were taken. It focuses

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on environment-friendly alternatives such as: 1 crore households will be able to obtain up to 300 units of free electricity per month, adoption of e-buses for public transport network, strengthening of the e-vehicle support system by supporting manufacturing and charging and launching of new scheme for bio manufacturing and biofoundry to support environment friendly alternatives.

For the purpose of development of infrastructure and investment, three major railway corridor programmes will be implemented under the PM Gati Shakti with the aim to improve logistic efficiency and reduce cost. Foreign investments will be promoted via bilateral investments treaties and expansion of existing airports and comprehensive development of new airports will be initiated under the UDAAN scheme. In order to empower the youth and foster entrepreneurial aspirations, 1.4 crore youth will be provided training under the Skill India Mission and 43 crore loans have been sanctioned under the PM Mudra Yojana. The same tax rates for direct and indirect taxes, including import duties have been retained for the year 2024. The average processing times of returns have been reduced from 93 days (2013-14) to 10 days (2023-24) thereby resulting in faster refunds.

The session ended with a short question and answer around that was conducted by the teachers. The session ended at 12.15 pm. 78 students attended the session. Ms. Shine De Souza, student of M. Com Part-II has drafted the report.

### **Live Screening of Interim Budget 2024**

1st February 2024

The Department of Economics & Banking organized 'Live Screening of the Interim Budget 2024' on 1st February 2024 in the smart classroom from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The Interim Budget was screened live with the objective of providing a platform to students and faculty to comprehend the intricacies of the revenue and expenditures of the government for the fiscal year 2024-2025. With the 'mantra' of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, and Sabka Vishwas' and the approach of "Sabka Prayas", the Union Minister for Finance and Corporate Affairs Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Interim Union Budget 2024-25 at the Parliament on 1st February 2024. She stressed that the Indian government is working towards development which is all-round, all-inclusive and all-pervasive, covering all castes and people at all levels working towards making India a Viksit Bharat by 2047. The budget comprised two parts – Part A, which focused on Social Justice, 'Garib Kalyan, Desh ka Kalyan' – assistance to the poor, Welfare of 'Annadata' – financial assistance to farmers, Momentum for Nari Shakti, PM Awas Yojana (Grameen), Rooftop solarization and muft Bijli, Ayushman Bharat, Agriculture and food processing, Research and Innovation for catalyzing growth, employment and development, Infrastructure, Railways, Aviation Sector, Green Energy, Tourism sector, Investments, and Reforms in the States for 'Viksit Bharat'. While part B broadly focused on direct and indirect tax proposals, tax rationalization efforts over the years, achievements in tax-payer services,

and the progress of the Indian economy over the last 10 years. Smt. Sitharaman highlighted that with a whole-nation approach, the country overcame challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, took long strides towards Aatma Nirbhar Bharat and laid solid foundations for Amrit Kaal. Defining GDP in her way, the finance minister said, that the government is focussed on more comprehensive



GDP: Governance, Development and Performance. She said that there is macroeconomic stability, investments are robust, economy is doing well, people are doing well, with greater aspirations for future, average real income has increased by 50 percent, inflation is moderate, people are getting empowered to pursue their aspirations, there is effective and timely delivery of programmes and large projects. The government will continue its focus on the upliftment of four major castes, that is, 'Garib' (Poor), 'Mahilayen' (Women), 'Yuva' (Youth) and 'Annadata'(Farmer). The total receipts other than borrowings and the total expenditure are estimated at ₹30.80 and ₹47.66 lakh crore respectively. A provision of ₹75,000 crore rupees as fifty-year interest free loan is proposed to support milestone-linked reforms by the State Governments towards Viksit Bharat. Proposal to retain same tax rates for direct, indirect taxes and import duties were announced besides other benefits. The finance minister concluded her presentation by proudly announcing that the government has succeeded with a strong belief of 'nation-first' and it is now appropriate to look at where India was till 2014 and where India is now" and expressed her confidence in the blessings of the people to achieve 'Viksit Bharat'. 32 students attended the session. Ms. Lizette D'Costa and Ms. Saruka Kalgutkar were the faculty in charge of the session.

### **Financial Fitness: Cultivating Your Wealth Potential**

3rd February 2024

The Department of Management Studies organised a One Day Workshop on 'Financial Fitness: Cultivating your Wealth Potential for TY BBA(FS) and M.Com students on 03<sup>rd</sup> February 2024 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm in the Smart classroom.

The objective of this workshop was to raise the level of financial awareness of participants and enable them to use the financial information provided to make better short-term and long-term decisions in managing their finances. The Resource Person for the workshop was the first Goan investment advisor with triple financial qualifications, Mr. Brendon Mascarenhas - Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA), a Certified Financial Planner (CFP) and a Chartered Wealth Manager (CWM).



The event began with a welcome address followed by the introduction of Mr. Brendon Mascarenhas. Mr. Brendon began the session by illuminating the importance of Financial Fitness. He mentioned the basics of Self-finance by providing simple real-life examples highlighting the time value of money and inflation, along with which he taught some basic financial calculations. He also provided insight on emergency fund planning, insurance planning, investment planning, reviewing investments, tax planning and retirement planning in detail. The Resource Person highlighted some newer knowledge about human capital, risk profiling and income expense analyses.

Mr. Mascarenhas explained the calculation of present value, future value, IRR, XIRR, to calculate the return, number of years, and monthly investments. He elucidated ways to analyse and choose the right investments, to manage a portfolio depending on individual goals, asset allocation, mutual funds, liquidity, saving and investment ratios, management of accounts, coverage of insurance and policy comparisons.

19 TY BBA(FS) students and 15 M.Com students attended the workshop. In their feedback, students said it was truly an inspiring and enlightening workshop, and the resource person addressed all their queries very well.

The Way Forward in Commerce & Accountancy Education


3rd February 2024

The event sought to analyze and discuss the key aspects of the interim budget presented by the Government. The panel comprised three distinguished speakers; Vice-Principal Professor Sanjay Sawant Dessai, CA Vinayak V. Dhumatkar, and CA. Royce Pereira. Assistant Professor Mr. Shreyas Desai moderated the session.

At the outset, the Principal of the College, Professor Prita D. Mallya, addressed the gathering and welcomed the panelists and the moderator. Ms. Cidel Rodrigues, student of TY B.Com., introduced the panelists. The session began with comments by the panelists on their general impressions of the budget. Professor Sanjay Dessai provided his scholarly perspectives on the overall budget by meticulously displaying the key components of the budget. CA Vinayak Dhumatkar, with extensive experience in finance and taxation, provided insights into the budget's fiscal policies and their implications on various sectors of the economy. While CA Royce Pereira, offered his expertise on the financial implications of the budget, focusing on taxation, investments, and fiscal management.

The panel discussion commenced with an overview of the key highlights of the Interim Budget 2024 presented by the government. Each panelist then presented their analysis and opinions on different aspects of the budget, including fiscal deficit targets, expenditure allocations, tax reforms, and sector-specific policies. Students enthusiastically participated in the discussion by posing various questions regarding the implications of the interim budget 2024 on various sectors, share markets, start-ups, taxes, government schemes, etc.

To conclude, all the panelists agreed that since the country is set to face the general elections, Budget 2024 is interim in nature, there are more expectations yet to be realised from the full budget which will be presented in July 2024 by the incoming government. Nonetheless, India has extensively with a strong balance between economic growth and fiscal consolidation reflecting the country's economic aspirations. It sets a broad direction for the management of the economy, focusing on growth, inclusivity, and reinforcing a procompetition stance. The budget steers clear of populism and emphasizes building capabilities and lowering entry barriers in the market economy. It promotes



development in infrastructure, particularly in physical, digital, and social aspects.

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The Head of the Department of Economics and Banking, Dr. Lira M. Gama delivered the Vote of Thanks, for a fruitful discussion packed with expert views and deliberations.

### Awareness session on TeleMANAS services

Consultant Psychiatrist and

Psychologist from the State
TeleMANAS Cell, Goa.

TeleMANAS is a component of the National Mental Health Programme started by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Ms. Safaa Sayad from SY B.Com commenced the session by providing a brief introduction of TeleMANAS Services. The session aimed at creating awareness of Tele services provided by TeleMANAS and reducing the stigma associated with mental health.

Dr. Sneha began the session by showing a video on emotions and discussed the importance of being aware of one's emotions. She then interacted with students and asked students to name a few mental health issues students face. The causes of mental health issues, such as parental or peer pressure, addiction, traumatic event and emotional dysregulation were explained to students. Dr. Sneha explained the importance of using the right mental health terms to explain a mental health condition. The relationship between addiction and the brain was discussed. An explanation of the brain reward circuit, different types of addiction and increased activity of dopamine neurotransmitters was provided to students.

Ms. Meghna Jadhav informed students about the availability and accessibility of TeleMANAS services. It aims to provide free tele-mental health services all over the country 24/7. They could be contacted through a toll-free number: 14416. The programme includes a network of tele-mental health centres spread across the States and UTs, providing mental health services in over 20 languages and trained counsellors running the first-line services. The

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service is free and available for all Indian citizens. A demo call was made to tele services to provide practical experience to students.

The session concluded with a Q&A segment and a Vote of Thanks proposed by Mr. Erville Rodrigues, student of the BBA programme. 38 students attended the session.
