

### ABOUT VIDYA VIKAS MANDAL

In June 1971, four young professionals - Adv. Hirba M. Naik Gaunekar, C.A. Ganesh M. Daivajna, C.A. Uttam N. Bene, C.A. Sheela N. Borkar - had met to share their concerns about the yawning gap between the need and availability of higher education opportunities for students of South Goa. The mismatch was most pronounced in the area of Commerce education. Students who could afford it, travelled to cities like Mumbai, Pune, Belgaum or Panaji to get their degrees. Other less fortunate youngsters either made do with the Science/Arts degree or did not pursue a higher education. Thus, they decided to establish a Commerce College. Encouraged and supported by Shri D. B. Wagh, Director of the Centre for Post-Graduate Instruction and Research of Bombay University in Goa, they set up Vidya Vikas Mandal, a charitable society, devoted to the cause of education. Shree Damodar College of Commerce & Economics is one of the institutions managed by the Vidya Vikas Mandal.





## ABOUT CAREER, TRAINING, INTERNSHIP, & PLACEMENT (C.T.I.P) CELL

The Career, Training, Internship and Placement (CTIP) Cell of the college strives to establish a connect with industry to attain the requirement for student employability and entrepreneurship, and provides adequate training and internship to the students, such that every student is either employed or facilitated to become an entrepreneur. The CTIP Cell attempts to bridge the gap between students passing out from the college and the expected skill set that our global or local industry expects, thus making our students globally employable or future entrepreneurs.

The CTIP Cell serves as an interface between the students and the corporate world. The Cell is responsible for organizing various qualitative training sessions in campus as per the requirements of the students & industry to equip students with the skill set to make them employable in the job market. The Cell also organises coaching classes for competitive exams such as banking exams, MBA entrance exams, GPSC, Goa SSC exam, overseas education entrance exams etc. The Cell enables the students to secure internship to enhance the students' understanding and applicability of the concepts learnt in the classroom. The Cell facilitates the process of placement of students through the Annual Placement Fair organised in the college campus. Reputed organisations are invited to the Placement Fair enabling students to secure jobs through campus recruitment.

### <u>Duties & responsibilities of Career Training, Internship & Placement (CTIP) Cell</u>

- Continually connecting with industry to assess the changing and updated skill set required to be employable or entrepreneurs.
- Working closely with industry to make students aware of various career opportunities.
- Organization of coaching classes for competitive exams.
- Enrolling interested Final Year students as members of the CTIP Cell.
- Organization of pre-placement training for student members registered with the CTIP Cell, to make the students industry ready and thereafter offer placement opportunities.
- The students undergo mock interviews and internships (full time / part time) to hone their employability skills.
- Carrying out all pre-placement procedures, such as inviting recruiters and encouraging them to register for the Placement Fair, preparation of the Placement brochure, etc.
- Coordinating placement programs as per requests received from recruiters during the year.
- Follow-up and collection of data (e.g. students recruited and joined, annual salary package, etc.) from recruiters post-recruitment.
- Collection of feedback from recruiters about the conduct of the placement fair, performance of students, suggestions for improvement, etc.




#### • Mock Interviews

## ABOUT ANNUAL PLACEMENT FAIR

Placements are a benchmark to the performance of any educational institute and it depicts the success and growth of the institution. At the end of the academic year, the CTIP Cell holds its Annual Placement Fair, where several companies or employers visit the college campus for recruitment. The Annual Placement Fair is designed to provide a wide range of opportunities for students to connect with different industries, explore careers and apply to jobs. More than 20 companies have been participating in the Placement Fair in the past and have witnessed the performance of the alumni. The 2025 Placement Fair is taking place on Friday 4th April 2025 from 9.30 am to 1.30 pm. ## **RECRUITMENT PROCESS**

Recruiters are requested to fill the enclosed 'Recruitment Registration Form (RRF)' and send it to the College by email on or before 31st March, 2025.

- Student Pre-Registration will start on **2nd April 2025** after the Recruiters' Profiles are displayed in the College.
- Interested students will fill in a Student's Registration Form and submit it to the Placement Cell with their résumé.
- Recruiters may, in accordance with their own policy, conduct a Recruitment Process of their preference: Interviews, Group Discussions, and Written Tests etc...
- Recruiters may conduct a pre-placement session on a mutually agreed date and time before the placement fair.
- Please note that all Recruiters will be conducting the selection process simultaneously and it may happen that a particular candidate may opt for more than one company. In view of this, Recruiters may conduct the selection process preferably in 2 slots (09.30am 11.30am and 12.45pm 01.30pm), if required.
- In the event the process cannot be completed on the same day, the concerned Recruiter may continue on a mutually agreed date and time.
- Recruiters shall, as far as possible, adhere to the process mentioned in the RRF. Any change in the Recruitment Process of the Recruiter may be communicated to the Placement Cell well in advance.
- Recruiters are requested to mail or deposit with the Placement Cell, their list of selected
  candidates along with a list of wait-listed candidates, in order of their preference by 10th April
  2025.
- All communication with students must necessarily be through the Placement Cell. Recruiters are requested not to communicate any offers directly to the candidates.
- Recruiters are requested to issue an offer letter to the selected candidates at the earliest.
- Selected candidates who feature on more than one Recruiter's List will have the liberty of accepting the offer of their choice.
- In the event of a selected student not joining a Recruiter, for any reason whatsoever, the candidates on the waiting list will be elevated. This will be done according to the order of preference given by the recruiters. The final decision of the candidates will thereafter be intimated to the Recruiters.

## GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING PLACEMENT FAIR

The CTIP Cell Placement Fair scheduled on 4th April 2025 is a crucial platform that bridges the gap between students and recruiters, offering valuable career opportunities. To ensure a smooth and professional recruitment process, students must adhere to a set of guidelines.

- 1. Update your resume with accurate and professional details.
- 2. Research participating companies and job roles to align your expectations.
- 3. Attend pre-placement training sessions and mock interviews for better preparation.
- 4. Follow a professional dress code (formal attire is mandatory).
- 5. Maintain a respectful and confident demeanour while interacting with recruiters.
- 6. Arrive on time and adhere to the event schedule.
- 7. Treat recruiters, faculty, and fellow students with respect. Disruptive behaviour during company presentations and interactions will lead to serious consequences and the student will not be allowed to participate in the Placement Fair.
- 8. Apply only to companies where you are genuinely interested. Accept job offers responsibly and do not back out after committing.
- 9. Exhibit a mature and responsible attitude throughout the placement process.
- 10. Carry multiple copies of your resume and necessary documents.
- 11. Be attentive and engage actively in discussions and interviews.
- 12. Listen carefully to recruiters and respond confidently.
- 13. Demonstrate good communication skills and a positive attitude.
- 14. Follow up with recruiters via professional emails if required.
- 15. Keep track of shortlisted companies and respond to their calls/emails.
- 16. Provide feedback to the CTIP Cell regarding the recruitment experience.
