After winning the toss and electing to bat, Damodar College amassed a massive 208/1 in their 20 overs.


Badal Naik delivered a spectacular innings, scoring 114 off 61 balls, supported by Om Naik's 57 off 47.

"You need to find space in your work life that you


love, and that people are willing to pay for. The real challenge is discovering your own Ikigai. The biggest mistake we make is comparing ourselves to

Damodar College BBA organises 'ASCEND'





"The struggle is to find your own 'Ikigai'. The biggest mistake we make is comparing ourselves to others," said Kakode.


He stressed on three critical skills that every person needed to inculcate- management, money management and in-


