

Poster Competition on Blood Donation cum awareness


6th – 11th October 2020

Mental Health Awareness Quiz

10th October 2020

On the occasion of World Mental Health Day on 10th October 2020, the VVM Counselling Centre organized an online quiz on the topic 'Mental Health Awareness.' The quiz was created by the Counselors of Shree Damodar College of Commerce & Economics, Govind Ramnath Kare College of Law, Vidya Vikas Academy and RMS Higher Secondary School.

The main aim of the quiz was to create awareness about mental health among students and the general public. The questions in the quiz consisted of twenty-five statements regarding mental health – respondents had to state whether the statements were myths or facts.

Participants scoring 50% and above were awarded certificates by Vidya Vikas Mandal. A total of 291 responses were recorded till 19th October 2020. Of the total responses recorded, 68% were from the student population, 7% were teachers and the remaining were members of the general public.

Ms. Elsa through her experience as a Consulting Psychologist and Health Stress Expert, explained how

negative mental health increases the likelihood of contracting COVID-19 as well as other lifestyle disorders. Ms. Amba spoke about how students could deal successfully with online examination-related stress. The webinar aimed to educate the participants on the importance of mental health particularly during these challenging times. 132 participants attended the webinar, which included NSS Volunteers as well as the faculty members of the College.

13th October 2020

The main objectives of the session were to get an update of the work done by students during the lockdown and provide further guidance as per industry requirements and also to understand the expectation of students from B.Voc Programme

The webinar started with the introduction of the Resource Person by Mr. Sumit Kumar. He briefly informed the students about the objective and purpose of the session.


Session II: 11.45 am to 12.30 pm

Online Guest Lecture "Financial Technologies: Evolving Paradigm of E-Commerce"

15th October 2020



The BBA(Financial Services) Department organized a guest lecture titled "Financial Technologies: Evolving Paradigm of E-Commerce' for Final Year students of the BBA(FS) programme. The guest lecture was organized virtually through Google Meet Platform on 15th October, 2020 from 12:00 noon to 1:00 p.m. 21 students and 3 faculty members of the Department attended the same.

Mr. Tyrone D'Souza, the co-founder of Mobobeat was the Resource Person for the guest lecture. Mobobeat is a mobile ad network that has been in business for the last 5 years with offices in India, Spain and Colombia. He elaborated on the evolution of FinTech, which has been instrumental in transforming e-commerce businesses globally. He highlighted aspects of FinTech such as Zerodha and algotrading, small case investments, Artificial Intelligence in investment decisions, freelance online careers in finance, bitcoin currency, alt coins, USD Teether, bank transfers vs bitcoin etc. He provided several examples to make the content more effective and enriching.

Mr. Tyrone addressed all the queries raised by the students. Students provided a very positive feedback about the guest lecture. Asst. Prof. Mayuresh Adsul compered the session, which was organized by Asst. Prof. Cinola Vaz and Asst. Prof. Mayuresh Adsul.

Guest Lecture on "The Impact Of COVID-19 On The Indian Economy"

15th October 2020



The BBA(FS) Department organised a guest lecture on "The impact of COVID-19 on the Indian Economy" on 15th October 2020. The lecture was delivered by Mr. Ameya Kamat, a financial analyst by profession who is also a founder & CEO at Altera Advisory Private Limited. He has worked in the financial sector for over 15 years.

Mr. Kamat started the lecture by giving an introduction to the Indian Economy wherein he discussed in brief about the history of our economy & our current economic position. He emphasized the fact that though our nominal GDP and GDP at PPP are high, our 139th rank in terms of per capita income portrays a very dull picture & this problem is making the process of economic revival a bit difficult for us.

He elaborated on the actual impact of COVID-19 wherein he said that over the years our growth rate has been in the bracket of 5-6% annually but it has plunged drastically to -23% due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He then highlighted a number of challenges to recovery such as weak demand, ballooning unemployment, lack of fiscal stimulus, rising inflation rates and so on.

He concluded by saying that in order to bring about economic stability, it is important to tackle the problems faced by people employed in the informal sector, as the sector constitutes 80-90% of the working population. Only then will we have high chances of reversal and be able to bounce back to normal.

The discussion was then followed by a question and answer session, wherein students put forth their doubts and also shared their views on the topic. It was an extremely enriching, informative and an interactive session where students acquired enormous knowledge on this topic. This lecture would certainly help them understand the economic situation amidst the current pandemic that seems to have no finish line as of today.

Guest Lecture on "Working Capital Management"

16th October 2020



The BBA(FS) Department organized an online guest lecture for the Second Year BBA(FS) students on 16th October 2020 from 11:45 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on the Google Meet platform. The lecture was on "Working Capital Management" and was arranged as part of the Financial Management course. The Resource Person for the session was CA Pankaj Pai Kakode, Director, Kakode Consultants Pvt. Ltd.

Ms. Devyani Chandrashekar Sirakaje, a student of the class, introduced the Resource Person. During the session, the resource person stressed upon some basic concepts and ideas viz. Working capital, the need for working capital, factors determining working capital, trade-off between current assets and current liabilities, working capital components, working capital cycle, working capital funding, and working capital ratios.

CA Pankaj Pai Kakode appreciated the active participation of the students as they asked a number of relevant questions.

16th October 2020


The Counseling Cell organised an activity 'Keeping Fit at Work' for all the SDCCE staff members on 16th







The Resource Person began by elucidating the progressive sequence of e-filing of Income Tax returns in India over the years. He highlighted that any individual who desires to file his/her Income Tax returns online must possess some basic, fundamental knowledge of

taxation. CA Borkar demonstrated the process of filing Income Tax returns through the Government of India authorized web portal. He also explained the types of forms available for e-filing of Income Tax returns.

The Resource Person addressed the numerous queries raised by the participants. The webinar ended with the Vote of Thanks proposed by Asst. Prof. Swati Bhat. 




their careers as that would also influence their mentees.

National Webinar on 'Farm Acts 2020: A Review'



The Department of Economics & Banking organised a National Webinar titled "Farm Acts 2020: A Review" on 24th October 2020 from 12:00 to 1:15 pm via Google meet. The Resource Person for the session was Dr. P. Anbalagan, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, Presidency College, Chennai.

The webinar started with the welcome address by Professor and Principal Dr. Prita D. Mallya followed by the introduction of the Resource Person by Ms. Farah Mendonsca, Assistant Professor in Economics and Banking.



Dr. P. Anbalagan began his presentation with a brief review of the current agricultural status in India. He then spoke about the major provisions of the three contentious Farm Laws, viz. Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Act 2020, the Farmers Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act 2020 and Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act 2020.

He also spoke on farmers' views on the Laws, the role of Minimum Support Price, the importance of procurement of food grains and analysed the State-wise procurement. He expressed his opinion about the role of the Agricultural Produce Market Committee. The speaker stressed on the role that Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan can play in uplifting the farmer community.

He further gave an elaborate explanation on the different reasons as to why States are fearful about the Farm Laws. Dr. P. Anbalagan also highlighted the traders' problems and the importance of Contract farming.

The last part of his presentation consisted of the analysis of The Farm Act 2020. He concluded saying 100% FDI will create an opportunity to export, thereby leading to more competition, better prices, improvement in infrastructure and farmers' ability to choose the mode of selling agricultural produce.

Ms. Lizette D'Costa Assistant Professor in Economics and Banking chaired the question answer session. The Vote of Thanks was proposed by Dr. Lira M. Gama HOD of Economics and Banking. The webinar was compered by Mr. Shrikant Madar, Assistant Professor in Economics and Banking.




The session covered the following topics:



The College IQAC, in collaboration with CII Goa Chapter, organized a Webinar on the topic "NEP 2020: Provisions and Implications" on 27th October, 2020 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. using Google Meet Platform. The Resource Persons for the Webinar were Mr. Lalit Saraswat, CEO, Sancoale Technologies and Mr. Deepak Khaitan, Founder & Director, Sunshine Worldwide School, Goa. The Webinar was targeted at all stakeholders – students, parents, teachers, employers, etc. and attracted 246 participants from all these segments.

Mr. Saraswat began the session with a quote that "Investment in Knowledge pays the best interest". He spoke

about NEP 2020 being major transformational reform the education sector aimed at achieving 100% Gross Enrollment Ratio in school education by 2030. Bridging the social gap, ensuring widespread access and participation, and emphasis on learning outcomes are the major goals of NEP 2020. He also mentioned that a significant component of the NEP is the National Mission on Mentoring; making quality mentors available pan India will be a great boon to students



who currently do not have access to such a privilege.

Mr. Saraswat also opined that Internalization of education is a parameter where Shree Damodar College can play a major role. He said that it is important to recognize that the world is flat and that globalization is here to stay; talent should be able to travel anywhere around the world easily. He concluded by saying that the College

has to foster the culture of lifelong learning and take NEP as the guideline to make youth of today more employable - there is a great choice of careers available today and graduates should be equipped to take advantage of this.

Mr. Khaitan began the second session by saying that NEP 2020 has changed the whole school structure and curriculum. The Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) aims to attain optimal outcomes in the domains of physical and motor development, cognitive development, social, emotional, ethical development, cultural development and development of communication and early language, literacy and numeracy. These are in line with the skills recognized by the World Economic Forum as essential workforce skills required by 2030.

Replying to the question asked by the audience on whether schooling in one's Mother tongue is a good proposition, he said that people should first learn to listen and speak rather than read and write. Any language can be best learnt at a very young age. He concluded the session by saying that "One size fits all" cannot be applied in education.


The Keynote Speaker was Prof. Santhosh

Prof. Santhosh explained about three key domains - Artificial Intelligence (AI), Machine Learning (ML) and Deep Learning (DL) and gave numerous real life applications of AI and ML.



The Alumni Engagement Cell in collaboration with Shree Damodar College Ex-students Association organized a Webinar on the topic 'COVID-19: Safety and Prevention' on 31st October, 2020 from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m. via the Google Meet Platform. The Resource Person for the Webinar was Dr. Jagadish Kakodkar, Professor and Head, Preventive & Social Medicine, Goa Medical College & Hospital. A total of 75 people registered for the webinar.



Dr. Jagadish Kakodkar enlightened the participants on various important aspects of the COVID-19 pandemic. He spoke about death rates and how they can be controlled, precautions to be taken when one is tested positive, ways in which COVID-19 spreads and need for social distancing.

He informed that the risk is high among people having pre-existing diseases such as cardio vascular diseases, diabetes, chronic respiratory diseases, hypertension, cancer, etc. Such people are likely to

face complications. He also mentioned that such cases cannot be managed at home and require proper monitoring by doctors.

Dr. Kakodkar said that death rates can be controlled or reduced if people are made aware about the precautions and measures to be taken. He specifically said that senior citizens, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years must take strict precautions.

Dr. Kakodkar stressed the importance of social distancing and following SOPs when found positive and also mentioned some myths of COVID-19. He informed that gargling alone cannot reduce the virus. He suggested that it is ideal to do gargling with an oral antiseptic such as 'Providone iodine'. But the most important precautionary measures are the use of a face mask and washing hands.
