

The Commerce Club of the Department of Commerce and Management organized a 5-day Online Student Development Programme (SDP) from 12:30 to 01:30 pm from March 1-5, 2021, in association with Bombay Stock Exchange Brokers' Forum. The broad theme of the SDP was "Fundamentals of Stock Market", and the resource Person was Dr. Aditya Srinivas.

**Day 1:** On Day 1, the program began with a welcome address by Vice Principal Dr. Rodney D'Silva, followed by the introduction of the Resource Person by Assistant Professor Marjina Shaikh. The topic for the day was "Working of Stock Market". The Speaker started the session with a brief introduction about the importance of stock markets. The session included various topics related to the working of stock exchanges such as working of broker, trading account, demat account, risk management, KYC of clients and difference between investment and speculation. The presentation was followed by a Q&A session. 70 students attended the session.

**Day 2:** The topic for day 2 was "Fundamental Analysis", wherein the Resource Person explained about the various factors that one needs to consider before investing. He also elaborated on economic analysis, industry analysis and company analysis with case studies, followed by a Q&A session. This session saw the highest attendance by 86 students.

**Day 3:** Dr. Aditya started the session on "Mutual Funds" with a brief presentation on types of mutual funds, advantages, working of mutual funds, role in wealth creation, SIP and its benefit, Mutual fund industry scenario. During the Q&A session he interacted with the students and explained about the importance and need to invest


in mutual funds. He also stressed on the benefits of investing early to get the maximum returns. 68 students attended.

**Day 4:** On the 4<sup>th</sup> day Dr. Srinivas demonstrated the Terminal Operations on Bombay Stock Exchange. He discussed about the top 30 companies on BSE and the strategies to invest in the stock market. He also elaborated upon portfolio diversification and the extent of diversification. The session, attended by 67 students, ended with a Q&A round.

Day 5: The topic for the last session was "Derivatives Market" and was attended by 69 students. Dr. Aditya elaborated upon the concept of trading in commodities as a derivative instrument, types of commodities traded,

risk exposure, factors pertaining to the growth of commodities trade. He then demonstrated the live trading method to students. He also explained that trading in derivatives requires huge amount of capital and a high risk appetite.

B.Com Coordinator, Dr. EdwinBaretto proposed the Vote ofThanks. The students were asked to



fill the feedback forms and answer an online quiz based on which 69 students were issued e-certificates. Assistant Professor Marjina Shaikh moderated the sessions.

#### Session on 'Basics of Cloud Computing and Virtualization'

The Department of Computer Science organized a session on Basics of Cloud Computing and Virtualization for the Computer Science faculty on 05<sup>th</sup> March from 12.30 pm to 02.00 pm at the Skill Development Centre in the Annexe Building.

The objective of the session was to understand the basics of Cloud Computing and Virtualization. The Resource Person for the session was Mr. Rajeev Vasudevan, Director of IT infrastructure of a well-known MNC.

During the sessions, basic concepts of Cloud Computing and Virtualization were explained. He listed the job opportunities available in these areas along with the required skills and certifications. He pointed out that if the College is planning to offer these courses at TYBCA, then the fundamentals should be taught from First Year onwards.

The BBA(Financial Services) Department jointly with Parivartan Solutions. Learning Mumbai organised webinar on the topic "Financial Literacy under SEBI Initiative To handle your major personal finance issues capably" for BBA(FS) students on 06th March

2021 from 09:00 to 10:00 a.m.. The session aimed to create awareness and educate the students on access to financial services, availability of various types of financial products and their features, and to develop the necessary skills and knowledge to become financially literate.

The Resource Person for the session was Mr. Veerdhaval Talpade, Vice President – Training & Development, Parivartan Learning Solutions, Mumbai.

At the outset, Assistant Professor Ms. Lizia V. Gomes welcomed the Guest Speaker followed by his introduction by Mr. Shawn Menezes from TYBBA(FS) - A.

6<sup>th</sup> March 2021




SHERNI - Bright Daughters of Jharkhand


A link to an online quiz on "Role Models around the Globe" prepared by Ms. Megha Mohan, Asst Prof in


The Gender Champ of the Women's Cell, Ms. Senelda Lopes proposed the vote of thanks.


The Quiz comprised 10 questions with 2 Points each and the participant had to score at least 70% to earn an ecertificate.


- 1) The objectives of wellness

The session laid emphasis on the importance of emotional intelligence and ways to improve it.



- 4) Govt College Borda


